
In fact, we would like to enlist your help this summer. If you are not already doing so, please make sure to read aloud to your child at least 20 minutes every day. Doing so builds listening and language skills, strengthens the parental bond, and helps instill a love for books. If you are looking for suggestions, the elementary reading team pulled together a list of some of their favorite books with links to audio recordings (see next page). Please keep in mind that these are only suggestions and that we strongly encourage your little one to discover books of interest to him/her. Also, while it is always nice to have a guest reader, it is almost guaranteed that you will be your child's favorite reader. Why not share one of your childhood favorites with your child this summer?

In addition to the book list, the elementary reading team also pulled together a list of some of their favorite online resources for access to free online books and games and resources to build or strengthen early literacy skills, including letter identification. You'll find this list after the book list.

NAEYC, the National Association for the Education of Young Children, also suggests, "encouraging your child to help you with thank you cards, shopping lists, or notes. They may start with scribbles or pictures, move into scattered letters, and finally write some recognizable words as they enter school. Appreciate their attempts and watch their skills develop with practice."

Finally, stay safe, have fun, and dive into as many books as you can with your child this summer. Without a doubt, it will be time well spent.




<u>All Are Welcome</u> by Alexandra Penfol and Suzanne Kaufman

The Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister



The King of Kindergarten by Derrick Barnes




One Fox: A Counting Book Thriller by Kate Read

Silly Sally by Audrey Wood



Pete the Cat and His Four Groovy Buttons by Eric Litwin




A Hippy-Hoppy Toad by Peggy Archer and Anne Wilsdorf

Ricky the Rock that Couldn't Roll by Jay Miletsky



The Kissing Hand by Audrey Penn




<u>Chicka Chicka Boom Boom</u> by Bill Martin


If You Give a Mouse a Cookie by Laura Numeroff


The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle
